SCHOOLS RUN WHILE SCHOOL BUILDINGS ARE SHUT DOWN

The Indian education system, based on real classroom premises with chalk (also marker), duster, and board, is finally witnessing a transition from offline mode to an online mode (with houses turned into classrooms, computer/Laptop/Mobile screens turned into boards and students attending classes through video calls) due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. The novel coronavirus made itself viral faster than any social media buzz and left everything in complete chaos. Along with every other sector, education too was quarantined for a brief period. But the preventive shutting down of school buildings by Government could not prevent schools to go on. With the real classroom gone(at least momentarily), teachers, students and parents collaborated to adopt the online teaching in virtual classrooms.

Though the concept of online teaching is not completely new, it has never been welcomed and adopted in such a mass scale as far as schools are concerned. Had it been some other time, this concept would have been critical and might have met with protest. Owing to this pandemic, the unprecedented scenario of online teaching can be relatable to the exponential downloading of apps like Zoom, MS Teams, and Google Meet and a surge in internet traffic.

The online classes began as a swift response to the urgent need for continuation of schools. The teachers and school principals deserve accolades for the way they turned their houses into classrooms and the parents too are praiseworthy for reciprocating with cooperative enthusiasm. Almost eight weeks have passed since online classes were rolled on. A few challenges have popped up in this brief period of transition from offline to online. Let us look at the challenges encountered so far.

Efforts commendable but effectiveness less palpable: A smooth conduction of online classes needs certain basic amenities; chiefly a Computer/Laptop/Tablet with webcam facilitated, a digital writing pad and above all the lifeline of any online business — a stable and high-speed internet. Currently, not all teachers are equipped with abovementioned amenities. Most of them somehow just managing with the best possible resource they have - the Smartphone. Smartphones have limitations and cannot replace a computer. This has dwindled the effectiveness of online teaching.

Trained but not trained: The B.Ed. Course, the revered training program for teachers, has so far not included the requisite training and skill development program needed for full-fledged online teaching. Thus, the lack of training and skill is evident in the struggle of teachers handling a totally online environment.

Lack of proper test in this testing time: A well-designed assessment is important to measure the effectiveness of teaching and learning. So far, most of the teachers are not tech-savvy and they are neither trained nor equipped to design such an online test which can substitute the traditional test system. Thus, unassertive teachers are finding it difficult to form the right strategies and pace to ascertain effective learning.

Absurdity behind the screen: The students are advised to turn off the audio and video so as to allow the teacher to deliver the lecture undisturbed. This gives them an opportune moment to slip away from the classroom (virtual) and utilise the smartphone (most of the students attend online classes via smartphone) for or whatever reasons they wish for. This practice is difficult to control as teachers and parents are under the impression that children attend online classes honestly.

Screening Pain: As children are exposed to computer / mobile screen for extended hours due to online classes, complaints of headache and Asthenopia (strained eyes) are becoming common.

Conclusion: The novel Corona Virus challenged us to work on novel ideas and tested our adaptability skills. The swift response and timely adaptation to facilitate the progress of our education system unhindered is itself an achievement. But this achievement is still limited to urban areas and mostly to private schools. Efficient strategies and their proper implementation will not only widen this achievement but also address and tackle the challenges faced so far. Switching the gear to online mode, the wheels of education will surely accelerate in this era of the internet.

So it is important to talk to them and explain that if we are careful we can stay healthy and happy.

Most of the time when I ask parents to spend quality time with their kids, they say that they are too busy. So God has given you a new opportunity to spend quality time with your kids. Talk to them, try to be their friends, play games with them, ask them what they want to do. But to spend quality time with your kids, you have to keep your own mind at peace, if you are stressed then you will pass your stress to the child.

I would also like to mention that due to lockdown and due to unavailability of other excursion activities, screen time of children has increased a lot along with adults. And since we can't reduce the screen time to zero or optimum, try to encourage informative and motivational movies or videos, try watching these things together.

The school is doing great with online classes which are not only academic but also extra-curricular like dance, art, physical activity and music. Despite the classes the children may not be able to cope up with everything taught because the different media of education, but it's more important that the kids are regular and enjoy the classes. These classes also help us regularize a routine for children, now they have some daily things to do; screen time has reduced. We also hope that their zeal to learn and study will not be lost when they go back to the routine School.

As for the questions I started with — as a doctor, I presume regular school may not start for a very long time (4 to 6 months); the ongoing classes will help cover the syllabus and catch up after school reopen, exams would be meaningful if students and parents keep up with their emotional stability, the result of one academic year is not going to change the whole educational learning of one person. As for the students who have Board exams this year, there might be some changes from the boards itself, for better outcomes. And yes, definitely we need to boost the confidence of the children who have been preparing for competitive exams from many years and now not knowing when would the exams be held.

I am sure with the help of teachers and parents together children will be able to sail smoothly through this Tsunami.
